(also known as Ministry of Consolation)

Getting Started

If your parish is in its initial stage of its bereavement ministry, the following resources will assist parishes as they begin a Bereavement Ministry in their parish as follows:

- 1) **Organizing Parish Events:** Before you begin a bereavement ministry in your parish, you may want to consider planning one or all of the following:
 - a) Liturgies of remembrance and prayer service to commemorate the deceased members.
 - Masses on the Commemoration of All Souls in November or another date to remember in a special way the loved ones who died in the past 12 months.
 - Candle lighting ceremony to honor the departed loved ones during Mass.
 - Reception after Mass for the bereaved families.
 - b) Memorial Mass last Saturday of the Month.
 - c) Grief Education Event and invite a guest speaker.
- 2) **Beginning Your Program Bereavement Ministry (Ministry of Consolation):** The documents and forms listed below are available at our office.
 - a) Phases of Bereavement Ministry: Phases include: Funeral Planning, Attending Funeral Rites, Meal programs for funeral, Follow-up, Grief Support groups, Liturgies of Remembrance.

Growing

For parishes who have established a Parish Bereavement Ministry, the following resources will assist Parishes enhance your Bereavement Ministry including resources for Parish Bereavement Support Groups:

- Parish-based bereavement support programs: Parish based bereavement group sessions provide a safe place where the bereaved can share their experiences with others and be supported by other parishioners who have also experienced the death of a loved one and who have received bereavement training. These parish-based bereavement groups are peer ministry not therapy support groups. Please find below a few bereavement support group resources for your consideration:
 - a) <u>Seasons of Hope Creating and</u> <u>Sustaining Catholic Bereavement</u> <u>Groups</u>: This program consists of four six -week seasons which is Christcentered and scripture-based. Each session explores mourning through scripture, prayer, reflection, activities, and faith sharing. For more information watch <u>Bringing Hope to the Bereaved in</u> <u>Y our Parish: Insights from the Seasons of</u> <u>Hope Approach</u> by AveMaria Press.
 - b) <u>Grieving with Great HOPE</u>: This is a Catholic faith-based program that consists of a five week grief support workshop DVD series that offers a prayerful, practical and personal approach for anyone who is mourning the loss of a loved one.

- c) <u>New Day Bereavement Program</u>: This program consists of ten weekly sessions which assist people to work through their grieving process. Each session begins with prayer and reflections combined with writing and sharing activities.
- d) <u>Harvesting Our Tears</u>: This program consists of an eight-week bereavement process which draws on the richness of the scripture, prayer, sacrament, theology, imagery, ritual, wisdom and tradition of the Catholic faith community.
- e) <u>Bereavement Ministry: A Leader's</u> <u>Resource Manual</u>: This program consists of 8 weekly sessions which focuses on various grief topics. Each session includes opening remarks, session presentation and a closing prayer.
- f) <u>GriefShare From Mourning to Joy</u>: This program consists of 13 weekly sessions which is Christ-Centered and Biblically based. It consists of three forms of communication 1) Video presentation, 2) Group Discussion and 3) Workbook exercises. The Leaders Kit consists of complete training material for church lay leaders, promotional tools, and video seminar teachings.
- 2) <u>Growing Through Grief: The Role of</u> <u>Support Groups</u> by Dr. Alan Wolfelt: This article includes excerpts from his book <u>The</u> <u>Understanding Your Grief Support Group</u> <u>Guide: Starting and Leading a Bereavement</u> <u>Support Group</u>. In this article Dr. Wolfelt defines the meaning of growth.
- 3) Responding to Problems in the Support Group Setting by Dr. Alan Wolfelt: This article includes excerpts from Dr. Alan Wolfelt's book The Understanding Your Grief Support Group Guide: Starting and Leading a Bereavement Support Group. This article provides helpful suggestions for dealing with challenging participants.
