

#### Matthew 23:1-12


Addressing the people and his disciples Jesus said, 'The scribes and the Pharisees occupy the chair of Moses. You must therefore do what they tell you and listen to what they say; but do not be guided by what they do: since they do not practise what they preach. They tie up heavy burdens and lay them on men's shoulders, but will they lift a finger to move them? Not they! Everything they do is done to attract attention, like wearing broader phylacteries and longer tassels, like wanting to take the place of honour at banquets and the front seats in the synagogues, being greeted obsequiously in the market squares and having people call them Rabbi.

'You, however, must not allow yourselves to be called Rabbi, since you have only one master, and you are all brothers. You must call no one on earth your father, since you have only one Father, and he is in heaven. Nor must you allow yourselves to be called teachers, for you have only one Teacher, the Christ. The greatest among you must be your servant. Anyone who exalts himself will be humbled, and anyone who humbles himself will be exalted.'



#### November 9—Feast of Dedication of the Lateran Basilica



The Lateran Basilica, officially known as the Archbasilica of Saint John Lateran, is one of the most important and significant churches in Christianity. Located in Rome, Italy, it holds a unique position in the Catholic Church for several reasons: Papal Seat: The Archbasilica of St. John Lateran is often referred to as the "Mother of All Churches" and is considered the Cathedral of Rome. It is the official seat of the Pope as the Bishop of Rome. This makes it the highest-ranking and most important of the four major basilicas in Rome. The other three are

St. Peter's Basilica, St. Mary Major, and St. Paul Outside the Walls.

Historical Significance: The Lateran Basilica holds a rich history. It was consecrated in the 4th century by Pope Sylvester I and served as the principal church in the Western world for centuries. It has been the site of numerous important church councils and events.

Architectural Grandeur: The basilica's architecture is impressive, with a stunning façade, a grand nave, and a beautiful interior. It has undergone several renovations and reconstructions over the centuries, but it remains a magnificent example of Roman ecclesiastical architecture.

Holy Stairs: Within the Lateran Basilica complex, there is a significant relic known as the Holy Stairs (Scala Sancta). According to tradition, these are the steps that Jesus climbed during His trial before Pontius Pilate in Jerusalem. The Holy Stairs are considered a highly important pilgrimage site for Catholics.

Statues and Art: The basilica features numerous statues, mosaics, and artworks that depict various religious themes. These works of art contribute to the spiritual and cultural significance of the basilica.

Papal Functions: Many important liturgical ceremonies and papal events take place at the Archbasilica of St. John Lateran. These include the Pope's traditional procession to the basilica on Holy Thursday, where he celebrates the Mass of the Lord's Supper.

Canonical Status: The Lateran Basilica holds a unique status in the Catholic Church. As the cathe-

dral of the Diocese of Rome, it is known as the "ecclesia urbis" (the Church of the City) and is symbolically the Pope's cathedral. This cathedral status is shared with St. Peter's Basilica, which is considered the "ecclesia orbis" (the Church of the World).

The Lateran Basilica's historical, religious, and architectural significance makes it a remarkable place for both Catholics and tourists alike. It stands as a symbol of the enduring spiritual and cultural legacy of Rome and the Catholic Church.
