Mark 1: 29-39

On leaving the synagogue, Jesus went with James and John straight to the house of Simon and Andrew. Now Simon's mother-in-law had gone to bed with fever, and they told him about her straightaway. He went to her, took her by the hand and helped her up. And the fever left her and she began to wait on them.

That evening, after sunset, they brought to him all who were sick and those who were possessed by devils. The whole town came crowding round the door, and he cured many who were suffering from diseases of one kind or another; he also cast out many devils, but he would not allow them to speak, because they knew who he was.

In the morning, long before dawn, he got up and left the house, and went off to a lonely place and prayed there. Simon and his companions set out in search of him, and when they found him they said, 'Everybody is looking for you.' He answered, 'Let us go elsewhere, to the neighbouring country towns, so that I can preach there too, because that is why I came.' Retreat Master's Bio.

Fr. Piotr Krakowiak SAC (ordained in Poland 1993) works currently at the University in Torun in the Department of Philosophy and Social Sciences. He has a lengthy career in hospice-palliative care as a volunteer, chaplain, psychologist, volunteers' coordinator, managing director of Hospice and Founder of the Hospice Foundation Poland, before moving into full-time teaching. Author and editor of a series of 18 books regarding end of life care in Polish, English, Italian, Russian, Ukrainian, German and articles in peer-reviewed journals. His research interests focus on using mixed methods to explore end of life care in different settings, from social work through spirituality & bereavement, as well as various aspects of volunteering and community involvement. Living in Edinburgh, Scotland from 2016, he is currently the Parish Priest for the Scottish & Polish community, also studying the concept of *Compassionate Communities* in the UK (grief, loss and new forms of bereavement support), in order to involve Polish and East-European migrants in Scotland into those activities. Since the beginning of the full-scale war in Ukraine in 2022 he has been involved in supporting the Pallottine Center *Future for Ukraine*, where over 100 women and children find safe homes. In his Lenten reflection in Barbados he will share his rich experience of end-of-life care & bereavement and his experience from various countries where he has lived and worked as a Pallottine.
